Who and what is their focus?

All new members & active members needing more attention/support including Friends@Home pairs and Friends with Pens pairs.

Providing individualized support & accommodations, retaining members, and welcoming new members. Retaining active members, including reengaging people who have been less active or become inactive recently.

Growing our circle.

Role and Responsibilities:

General

- Work closely with the organization's staff to guide new members in joining our community and support our active members with a wide range of disabilities, including mental health disorders, through individualized support and accommodations
- Support and develop relationships with current youth and their families, as well as recruiting new youth and teens
- Recruit new teen friends and families through Jewish schools, congregations, youth groups, at individual homes, referrals, schools, and honor societies
- Work directly with teens and their parents, as well as families who have children with
 disabilities within the Richmond community and surrounding areas; the youth that participate
 in our programs range in age from young children to young adults
- Keep all information about families confidential
- Inform Executive Director of any changes in families and/or situations which may arise
- Review Join Our Circle report to see who is interested in our programs
- Attend monthly board meetings with detailed reports
- Copy or blind copy Executive Director on all Friends @ Home related emails
- Exchange all contact information with families involved
- Encourage our families involved with our Friends programs to attend events
- Home visits to families to set up Friends at Home program

- Stay abreast of and develop relationships with organizations in the community that could benefit our youth & their families
